Astroth's career in academia began as a member of the clinical faculty at Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington, Illinois in 2001. As a member of faculty at Mennonite College of Nursing at Illinois State University, her teaching responsibilities include courses in Adult Nursing, Epidemiology and Aggregate-based Health Promotion, Emergency Nursing, Community Health Nursing, Management Dimensions of Professional Nursing and also an online research course for the RN-BSN program. She is the co-author of the Pocket Guide to Nursing Diagnosis.

She is currently an assistant professor at Mennonite College of Nursing at Illinois State University. In addition to her teaching responsibilities, Astroth conducts research related to measuring exercise readiness (stages of change), healthy lifestyles, clinical nurse leadership, and tobacco control practices to improve health and health care.

Dr. Kim Astroth started her academic training at Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington, Illinois where she graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing in 1977. Enrolled in the master of science program at the University of Illinois in Urbana, she graduated with a Master's Degree in Adult Health Nursing in 1988.

Continuing her academic pursuit, Astroth enrolled in the doctoral program at the University of Missouri in St. Louis in 2000 and successfully defended her Ph.D. dissertation in 2006.
