Policy

Students residing in the Nursing TLLC must complete the following requirements each semester to be considered a resident in good standing and remain on the floor each semester:

1. Participate in two nursing-related educational programs each semester .
2. Attend two social programs each semester (i.e. SNA meeting, SNA activity, PROUD social event, lunch with the Deans, or other social program communicated via email).
3. Remain in good judicial standing with Illinois State University.
4. Check ISU email regularly for updates regarding nursing programming

*Quiet hours will be voted on by the floor at the beginning of the year, but will not exceed 11 p.m. Failure to meet any of these requirements each semester will result in removal from the TLLC floor.
